programme, to support children and families. The
programme will support the whole family with
making small achievable changes to improve long
term health.

Here's what you can expect:

- An offer of 1:1 health coaching personalised support and guidance from a
   member of our Healthy Cornwall team.

To apply you need to have at least one child aged 5-12 in your household who is above their ideal weight for their height and age. You can check this using this easy NHS BMI calculator.

Fill in the <u>enquiry form</u> selecting Healthy Weight and then Healthy Families (5-12-pilot) or call on 01872 324200 to apply.

If you qualify for the scheme our children and young people's team will then make contact with you to arrange access and any further support.
