Building Works

We are constantly looking to enhance the school building and grounds ensure the school is safe, comfortable and effective place where children can learn. Much of this work goes unseen. Over the last year, we have had the heating system upgraded, a new computer network installed in stages and energy efficient windows fitted in certain areas.

One project that will be visible is the installation of perimeter fencing. This work will commence next week after nearly a year of planning and funding. This will ensure that the school meets the Department for Education guidelines on school safety. This will ultimately keep children and staff safe should an incident arise, but also help protect the school against criminal damage as has happened in the past. We are thankful to Cornwall Council for their support, advice and enterprise in making this project happen.
