Wrens class

This week Wrens have been learning about the story of Funny Bones. We used flour and black paper to make our handprints and then we used pipe cleaners to make the bones in the hand.

Doves class

Doves are enjoying our new unit in computing on data handling. This week, we have looked at a map of a zoo and collected data on how many of each of the different animals there were. We then used a program to represent this data in a pictogram. The children added the animals to the pictogram that they required then used the + button to increase the number of animals to the correct amount. Next they added labels for the names of each animal. Once compete, the children printed their pictograms for their computing books.

Puffins class

This week in PE we have been learning how to make shapes using our bodies in gymnastics. We made static shapes, shapes in the air, symmetrical shapes and shapes incorporating rhythmic gymnastics apparatus. We put together

sequences involving a variety of body shapes and other gymnastic movement such as jumping. We had the opportunity to take part in individual, paired and small group activities. Finally, we created and performed routines and sequences in pairs and groups.

Buzzards have read lots of poems this week by Kate Wakeling. Some were funny and some talked about serious issues. The poems included a range of techniques and language like rhyme, alliteration and figurative language. They have been spotting similes, metaphors and

personification and deciding what is meant by each. Buzzards also continued their work in computing by learning how to use search engines. They completed lots of challenges and also had the chance to explore our school website.
