Paralympian Visit

On Tuesday, paralympian Jonathan Paterson visited the school. He completed a fitness circuit with all of the children, as well as sharing his incredible story.

Jonathan has compete in 3 paralympic games, representing Great Britain at football. At the age of 16 he was made captain of the Great Britain side. He has also represented Scotland over 100 times and scored over 60 international goals. This is despite being told at a young age that he would never walk or talk due to having cerebral palsy.

It was a joy to hear Jonathan's story and witness how he inspired the children. The fitness circuit was also an opportunity to raise money to purchase new sports equipment for the school. To date in the region of £1000 has been raised. Please could all sponsorship money be brought into school at the beginning of next week.
